RAM PALS BY TRICIA DELGADO

What is Ram Pals?

This school year one of our active approaches to Social & Emotional Learning (SEL) and improved literacy skills is our district-wide Ram Pals initiative. All students in the district have been paired with another student in the district to become Ram Pals. Ram Pals can result in students being paired with another student outside of their school site. For example, a 3rd grade student may be paired with a 10th grade student.

Our Ram Pal relationships are used to foster new friendships while practicing literacy skills. Students practice social skills by creating new friendships as they learn about their Pal's interests, culture, family and education. Ideally, Ram Pals are strangers whose friendships are based solely on their exchange of handwritten correspondence. Students in grades K through 12 are asked to write to their Ram Pal at least once a month. Homeroom teachers collect the letters each month and they are screened, sorted and delivered.

It didn't take long for the teaching staff to see how much their students were enjoying their Ram Pals and Ram Pals expanded to include teachers. As a result of the teachers enjoying their Ram Pal we began to include everyone from all district offices, not just teachers and students. Adult staff is paired with another adult in the district who does not work at the same work site. We are all enjoying getting to know everyone around us a little bit better.
